What is SASAH?

The School for Advanced Studies in the Arts and Humanities offers a learning experience unique in Canada. Combining interdisciplinary dialogue, language acquisition, community engagement, experiential learning, digital instruction, and international study, students in SASAH's 4-year undergraduate program realize their creative potential to transform the world through critical thought, cultural production, creative activity, and community engagement.

Western's SASAH Program

Each year SASAH accepts 25 diverse, highly engaged candidates for enriched study that integrates thought and practice from multiple perspectives:

Cultural: exploring complexities of human achievement, expression, and motivation

Linguistic: competency in languages other than English

Experience: access to community service and professional learning

Global: contact with communities at home and abroad

Drawing on the Faculty of Arts and Humanities' national reputation, SASAH is a catalyst for innovation and excellence in teaching, research, and student-directed learning. SASAH Fellows are drawn from the Faculty's 135+ professors, including Canada Research Chairs, Fellows of the Royal Society of Canada, Distinguished University Professors, 3M Teaching Fellowships, and Western's Hellmuth Prize and Edward G. Pleva Award.

Admission:

SASAH is a direct admissions program accepting 25 students per year. The minimum overall average for admission is 90%. Students interested in SASAH must 1) apply to the Faculty of Arts and Humanities at Western using the OUAC application form; and 2) submit a written Statement of Interest to sasah@uwo.ca. SASAH Research Fellows shortlist candidates to be interviewed for final acceptance to the School. In exceptional cases we admit students to the program's second year.

SASAH's Advisory Council is comprised of international leaders in not-for-profit, culture, theatre, business, finance, and publishing, among other fields.

Location:

SASAH is based in Weldon Library, on the main campus of Western University in London, Ontario, Canada.

Tuition:

The cost of enrolling in SASAH is the regular full-time tuition fee paid by students registered in the Faculty of Arts and Humanities.

Scholarships:

Entrance scholarships and other funding for SASAH are available. Visit our website for details.

Degree:

Graduates receive a Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Arts and Humanities, as well as a Major or Honours Specialization from another program in the Faculty of Arts and Humanities, or another program at Western.

Student Experience:

SASAH learning extends beyond the classroom to campus and community, including participation in the SASAH Events Committee and Blog Team. These pursuits are logged on students' Co-Curricular Records, an essential document for future professional development.

Housing:
