As stated by Vea Vecchi (2006), in the Preschools of Reggio Emilia, Art Education is intended as a central element in children's processes of knowledge-building. In Reggio's educational philosophy, the space dedicated to artistic and aesthetic education is called "Atelier". The Atelier is a place closely connected to the other school environments, aimed at fostering children's agency by allowing them to explore visual and expressive languages in strict synergy with verbal, body and logical ones. This contribution addresses the visual languages by considering them as means of inquiry of the world, as media that foster children in building bridges and relationships between cognitive and expressive processes.
