Outline

This primarily self-directed course will provide an opportunity for a student to investigate a topic of their choice through a literature review. The topic will be chosen in consultation with the instructor, who will, if necessary, recommend a selection of key references. The course will be evaluated on the basis of a written paper (Maximum 30 pages, including double-spaced text and illustrations) and an informal seminar presentation. Ad-hoc tutorial and discussion sessions can be arranged during the term, as necessary.

Evaluation: Written paper 80% Seminar presentation: 20%
