

Land Acknowledgement

We acknowledge that Western University is located on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabek (Ah-nish-in-abek), Haudenosaunee (Ho-den-no-show-nee), Lūnaapéewak (Len-ahpay-wuk) and Attawandaron (Add-a-won-da-run) peoples, on lands connected with the London Township and Sombra Treaties of 1796 and the Dish with One Spoon Covenant Wampum. With this, we respect the longstanding relationships that Indigenous Nations have to this land, as they are the original caretakers. We acknowledge historical and ongoing injustices that Indigenous Peoples (e.g. First Nations, Métis and Inuit) endure in Canada, and we accept responsibility as a public institution to contribute toward revealing and correcting miseducation as well as renewing respectful relationships with Indigenous communities through our teaching, research and community service.







The Beijing 2022 Winter Olympic Games are just around the corner and you could bring a little fun into the classroom by running your very own Olympic games!

Split your class into teams and let them have an Olympic themed learning! Depending on your classroom and teaching beliefs, you may choose to have points and medals or just let your students enjoy the activities without the competitive aspect.

Here are some ideas for each subject that could be added to your game schedule

Literacy - Have students create a story about the Winter Olympics or write about a sport or an Olympic athlete.

Math - This one may be tricky but depending on the grade, you could create word problems that could get them to add scores or figure out the area of an Olympic stadium

Science - There is a lot of science happening for each sport, again depending on the grade, you could introduce friction or advance to torque

The Arts - Have students create their own flag and anthem!

Gym - This is probably the easiest way to include the Olympic theme - let your students try some Winter Olympic sports!

IJNAR NEW YEAR

Lunar New Year (also known as Chūnjié (春節), Tết (nguyên Đán), Seollal (설날), Shōgatsu (正月) just to name a few) is a new year celebration for many Asian countries that follow the *lunisolar* calendar.

This year, the Lunar New Year is on Feb 1 and changes every year depending on the phases of the moon. Some cultures also have zodiacs that rotate every new year. This year is the "Year of the **Water Tiger**".

Please be sure to not only call it "Chinese New Year" as many different Asian countries celebrate the new year and not only those who are of Chinese descent.


