The **Carol Buck Graduate Scholarship in Epidemiology** is presented annually to an outstanding graduate student. The scholarship was established to honour Dr. Carol Buck, whose affiliation with the department of Epidemiology & Biostatistics was from 1952 to 2004. Throughout her career, Dr. Buck's work demonstrated a passionate commitment to advancing human health. Using rigorous methods of epidemiology to identify and correct the causes and determinants of ill-health, she became an international leader in the discipline. Carol's colleagues and former students respected her amazing clarity of thought and communication. She was a gifted teacher who had a significant impact on many graduate students, medical students and colleagues. The scholarship will be awarded in a ceremony following the annual **Carol Buck Lecture**, given by a distinguished academic from the field of Epidemiology.

## Carol Buck Lecture: Dr. Moira Stewart

**Director, Centre for Studies in Family Medicine  
University of Western Ontario**

Dr. Stewart leads the System Integration and Innovation Network as well the Primary Health Care System program in the MOHLTC's new Applied Health Research Network Initiative (AHRNI). Dr. Stewart has published widely on the topic of Patient-Centred Care and has edited with colleagues an international series of books applying the patient-centred clinical method. She is the Principal Investigator on a CIHR Strategic Training Grant and Principal Investigator on the DELPHI (Deliver Primary Healthcare Information) project, creating a researchable database of the Electronic Medical Record data of 25 family physicians in Southwestern Ontario. She has conducted a number of intervention studies of education for Family Physicians and of new models of integrated care.

Dr. Stewart received the James Mackenzie Medal of the Royal College of General Practitioners (2004), The College of Family Physicians of Canada Family Medicine Researcher of the Year Award (2007), the Martin J. Bass Recognition Award, Department of Family Medicine, (2008), is Co-recipient of the Schulich Award of Excellence – Team Award (2010), and Fellowship in the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (2010).
