The Department of Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University, London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC) and St. Joseph's Health Care London (St. Joseph's) are seeking **a physician for a full-time clinical academic appointment** to Western as Chair of the Division of Critical Care Medicine, and LHSC Head and St. Joseph's Chief of the Program of Critical Care encompassing the Departments of Medicine, Anaesthesia and Surgery.

Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification, in Critical Care Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD, or equivalent, and must be eligible for certification in the province of Ontario. The successful candidate will hold an academic appointment at the rank of Associate or Full Professor with a Continuing Appointment.

The Critical Care Program at LHSC is situated across several units in two hospitals. University Hospital is home to the Cardiac Surgery Intensive Care Unit (16 beds) and the Medical/Surgical Intensive Care Unit (21 Level 3 beds). Critical Care at University Hospital also supports a 5 bed Critical Illness Recovery Program for chronically critically ill patients who are actively weaning. University Hospital supports Cardiac Care (including advanced mechanical support), Clinical Neurosciences (Neurology, Neurosurgery with an active Epilepsy and Interventional Neurology services), and Transplant (Heart, Liver, Kidney and Kidney-Pancreas). Victoria Hospital is home to the Critical Care Trauma Center (35 Level 3 beds) and a Level 2 Step down unit (7 beds). Victoria Hospital supports Trauma, Vascular Surgery, Thoracic Surgery, and Oncology. Both hospitals have robust Rapid Response Teams. In addition, the Critical Care group supports a "Step-up" capacity at St. Joseph's Health Care London for patients at risk of deteriorating.

The Program is comprised of physicians from Anesthesia, Surgery, Medicine and Emergency Medicine. We have a nationally recognized Royal College accredited Residency Training Program in Adult Critical Care Medicine with over 20 trainees as well as Fellowship Programs in Cardiac Surgery Critical Care, Neurocritical Care and Point of Care Ultrasound.

The successful candidate will have an outstanding record of excellent leadership and interpersonal skills, clinical service expertise, and proven academic achievement within a clinical teaching environment. The preferred applicant will have a strong record of research productivity and will continue to contribute to the research goals of the Division. The successful candidate will also have a commitment to and demonstrated aptitude for teaching, and will be expected to teach at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, and may include supervision of graduate trainees. The successful candidate will be expected to promote and contribute to excellence in trainee education. The successful candidate will also have demonstrable organization, business and financial skills.
