







## PAEDIATRIC ENDOCRINOLOGIST CLINICAL ACADEMIC POSITION

## Department of Paediatrics Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Western University

The Department of Paediatrics, Children's Hospital, London Health Science Centre, and Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Western University is seeking a Paediatric Endocrinologist to join our established Division of Paediatric Endocrinology.

The Division of Paediatric Endocrinology provides a comprehensive ambulatory and in-patient service to a population of about 1.5 million in southwestern Ontario. Children with the full spectrum of endocrine conditions, including Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes, disorders of growth, puberty, thyroid, adrenal, pituitary function, calcium metabolism, disorders of sexual development, and gender dysphoria are cared for in a range of specialty clinics. Our division works closely with endocrinology nurses and a full inter-professional Diabetes Education Team. The Division of Paediatric Endocrinology works closely with our Adult Endocrinology Division at St. Joseph's Health Center to ensure a seamless transition of care for our young adult patients. The Division is also very active in undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing medical education.

Candidates for this position must have an MD or equivalent degree and eligibility for licensing in the Province of Ontario. Subspecialty certification in Paediatric Endocrinology from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or equivalent is required. The successful candidate will hold a full-time Limited Term Clinical Academic appointment at the Assistant or Associate Professor level, or a Continuing Clinical Academic appointment at the Associate or Professor level, depending upon qualifications and experience at the time of appointment. The successful candidate will have a keen interest in academic medicine, the ability to collaborate effectively with all other members of the health care team and office staff, and will be expected to participate in team-based health care and teaching, at the undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing professional development levels. The candidate will be committed to contributing to the academic deliverables of the division, including continuing medical education and research. The successful candidate will also be expected to supervise graduate trainees.

In addition, Children's Hospital has 64 general paediatric beds, 46 neonatal beds and a very active emergency department. The Department of Paediatrics in London has over 100 faculty members, 40 trainees, and provides a full array of Paediatric sub-specialty services. The Children's Hospital has a Quality and Safety Committee and has formed partnerships within various international quality improvement initiatives. The department has 5 basic scientists as core members and numerous opportunities exist for clinical, epidemiological, translational, and basic science research.

London has a metropolitan census of 530,000 people with the amenities of a big city but friendliness of a small town. London is located in the heart of the Great Lakes region, 2 hours from both Toronto and Detroit.
