

DIRECTOR, SCHOOL of COMMUNICATION SCIENCES AND DISORDERS

The Faculty of Health Sciences (FHS; www.ca/fhs/) at Western University invites applications for the position of Director, School of Communication Sciences and Disorders (the School; www.ca/fhs/csd). The School is seeking a transformational Director who will lead a dynamic group of researchers and educators, and who will contribute meaningfully to the highly collaborative FHS Leadership Team. Along with demonstrated expertise in research, teaching, and leadership, the ideal candidate will have a track record as an excellent communicator, strategic thinker, with experience in collaboration and team building. The term of the Director appointment is five years (renewable).

The selected candidate will be appointed to a tenured academic position at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, as determined by both experience and qualifications. The successful applicant will have a Ph.D., or equivalent, in fields related to speech-language pathology (SLP) and/or audiology and show evidence of accomplished research, teaching, and leadership. Having an entry level degree in SLP or audiology would be an asset. The successful applicant will also have a demonstrated capacity to contribute substantively to an inclusive and diverse academic community. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The anticipated start date of the appointment is **July 1, 2022**, or as negotiated.

The School is an international leader in the professions of audiology and speech-language pathology, offering Master of Clinical Science degrees in Audiology and SLP and participating in the FHS thesis-based graduate program in Health & Rehabilitation Sciences (HRS). The HRS Program was the first in Canada to host a combined clinical-research degree (i.e., MCISc-PhD) in Speech and Language Science and in Hearing Science. The School includes the H.A. Leeper Speech and Hearing Clinic, which provides community assessment, intervention, and assistive devices services for individuals across the lifespan. The approximately 170 students enrolled in the SLP, and audiology programs are provided with practicum opportunities within the clinic. The School includes 27 full-time faculty members who are active in research, education and service delivery including the following areas: pediatric to adult hearing assessment and intervention, balance disorders, preschool and school-age speech and language disorders, voice, fluency, swallowing and acquired neurogenic communication disorders. The School has strong collaborations with the National Centre for Audiology, the Canadian Centre for Activity and Aging, the PRECISe Group, the Faculty of Engineering, the Brain and Mind Institute and many others.
