Assess and prepare equipment and chemical mixture	a) Back injury	a) Assess and inspect equipment such as pail or bucket do not exceed weight restrictions when lifting products.	
	b) Overexertion strain	b) Do not exceed weight restrictions when lifting products.	
	c) Slip, trip, fall	c) Staff to watch proper footing and pedestrian traffic around them with caution to work environment awareness. Leave wet floor signs in position where spillage occurs, use barriers and signage and, if possible, close area until floor is cleaned and dry.	

e) Electrical contact/shock	fans, exhaust fans, opening of doors and while safely protecting environment and neighbouring office or public spaces. Ensure signage is displayed regarding entrances for chemical storage per any applicable Provincial or Federal Regulations. e) Avoid splashing and control any water hoses so that any powered equipment, electrical cords, and receptacles are not exposed to contact.
