POTENTIAL HAZARDS

ACTION OR PROCEDURE

Assess and prepare Personal Floatation Device	a) Back injury b) Overexertion strain c) Slip, trip, fall onto deck or into the pool water d) Submersion underwater, drowning, aspiration of water,	a) Assess and inspect equipment such as pail or bucket b) Do not exceed weight restrictions when lifting products c) Staff to watch proper footing and pedestrian traffic around them with caution to work environment awareness. Leave wet floor signs in position where spillage occurs, use barriers and signage and if possible close area till floor is cleaned and dry. d) Floatation Device to be Ministry of Transport Canada approved and in good condition. Fitting is to be of correct size for weight and size of caretaker and worn within 6 metres of pool edge.
Weight restrictions for Caretakers to be observed	Overexertion strain injury	See job descriptions 30kg/65lbs regular lifting and intermittent lifting of 41kg/90lbs caretaker

Assign appropriate staff	Overexertion strain injuries	Lead Caretaker and/or Supervisor organize crew to job requirements Re-instruct staff as required as to safe ergonomic operation to avoid repetitive injuries if area is to be manually cleaned
