


Figure 5: 1968 Master Plan








2007 Master Planning Principles

- Respond to changes in academic mission and technology innovations
- Preserve existing natural features and maintain & enhance landscaped open spaces
- Provide direction for University growth and change (sustainability)
- Preserve and enhance architectural integrity
- Preserve academic interaction while decompressing the campus (supporting interdisciplinarity and creating communal space)
- Enhance University/City relationships

2007 Space Planning Principles

- Future growth flat undergraduate, increasing graduate student population and research space
- Central space to support and enhance the student experience
- Assess space needs to target programs/areas with the greatest need (support interdisciplinarity)
- Enhance interaction and collaboration among students, faculty and staff (create communal space)

Interdisciplinarity and Common Space

Recommendations for Provision of Common Space - 2007

 Common space should be incorporated into new academic buildings and into significantly renovated academic space

Recommendations for Future Classrooms – 2009

 Classrooms appropriate for undergraduates and graduate students should be created in the centre of campus













President's Advisory Committee on Environment and Sustainability (PACES)

- co-chairs: VP Academic and VP Resources & Operations
- established with adoption of Environment and Sustainability Policy, June 2010
- 15-members spans Western community (including graduate and undergraduate students)



President's Advisory Committee on Environment and Sustainability (PACES)

Mandate:

- establish specific goals for sustainability
- develop communication tools
- advise on policy
- report annually to the University Community
- June 2012 a Sustainability Vision, with associated Goals and Objectives




Western Today

- Annual utility bill: \$22.5 million
- 8 million ft² +
- 87+ buildings
- 16kms of roadway
- 15kms of sidewalks
- 1187 acres of land
- 2,000 spots for bike parking
- 6,300 parking spaces in 30 lots





Sustainability





Western Initiatives: LEED

- Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design
- Rating system for the design, construction and operation of high performance green buildings
- Ensures sustainable building design including: energy and water efficiency measures, natural material selection, and air quality
- Western has mandated that it will achieve silver certification or greater for renovations and new building projects

Western Initiatives: Recycling

 Western produces approx. 2,000 tonnes of garbage annually:

- 15% are coffee cups
 - Use a reusable mug

– 20% are items that are recyclable(paper, bottles, cans)

- Think before you throw it away
- Be diligent



Western Initiatives: Recycling

- 240 tonnes of organics are collected annually
- Battery collection program
 - 1000kgs diverted in 2010
 - Battery bins located on every floor in every building
- Ink Jet Recycling
- Outdoor Recycling Bins (Summer 2012)





Western Initiatives: Hospitality

Mission Statement:

- Hospitality Services is committed to creating, producing and enhancing a sustainable culture for the life legacy of the Western community
- "No-Idling" policy
- Elimination of Styrofoam
- Bring your own mug...save 10 cents!



Western Initiatives: Water

- Installed more efficient shower heads and faucets in residences and recreation centre saving:
 - 45,522 m³ of water and \$66,000 annually
 - 140,853 m³ of natural gas and \$59,000 annually
- Installing water filling stations on campus:
 - 15 installed to date; 9 residences summer 2012
 - Touchless, and quick-fill
 - Provides filtered water





Western Initiatives: Electricity

- Last 5 years replaced T12 lights with 50,000 more-efficient T8 lights (approx. 30% more efficient)
- Lighting control systems installed in UCC have saved 41,226kWh and \$4,122
 - Don't use more light than needed
 - Use task lighting
 - Make the most of natural light
 - Switch off lights in empty rooms
 - Turn the lights off when you leave the room!

You can save up to 15% just by turning off lights in rooms and corridors that aren't being used



> Current Usage: 107.3 kW




Wind Tunnel has consumed **1,090 kWh** so far today

Current Usage: 32.3 kW




Collip has consumed **295 kWh** so far today

Essex Hall has consumed **2,372 kWh** so far today









Energy Conservation

- Eastern Kentucky University- 50% reduction in energy use since 2005
- UBC 2008 Energy service audit of 288 buildings - energy and water savings of \$4.2million per year
- MIT, 2005-2010 invested over \$4 million in energy conservation measures saving over \$3M annually



Colorado State University Solar Project

One of the largest solar plants on a US campus.





UBC Sustainable Food Systems



- UBC procures ONLY 100% fairly traded, organic, shade-grown coffee.
- Electric Vehicles for campus catering.
- Engaged over 900 students on food-related research

UBC Farm



Sustainability Action Funds

- "How do we inspire innovation and involvement by staff, students and faculty around sustainability?"
- On many campuses including Queens, Concordia, UBC
- Funded by specific donors, energy savings, tuition add-ons, etc.



ETH Zurich - Switzerland

- Has an 80% non-vehicular transportation rate on its campus.
- Free or discounted public transit fares
- Subsidies for carpooling with car sharing program for staff and students
- Self-service bicycles available for free for three hours on campus

Sustainable Concordia's Ambassador Program

 A member of Concordia's staff or faculty who strives to promote and encourage sustainable actions and attitudes at Concordia.

 Provides concrete steps to contribute to sustainability on campus.
