Course Aims

Korean 2200 is an intermediate modern Korean language course with continuing practice in basic spoken and written Korean. The course aims to:

- further develop students' speaking, listening, reading and writing skills in an integrated manner that builds on the vocabulary and grammar acquired in Korean 1030.
- expand students' understandings about Korea, language, and people by exposing them to relevant topics pertaining to Korean culture and values. In so doing, the course will incorporate Korean video clips and web-resources.
- help the students to be more efficient inter-cultural communicators.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, students are expected to be able to:

- communicate and discuss more advanced topics in Korean. (e.g. making Korean foods, describing people, discussing weather, expressing feelings etc.)
- write and read more advanced passages in Korean (e.g. Korean foods, personality, feelings, weather, illnesses)
- acquire more advanced forms of vocabulary and grammar (e.g. plain and formal speech styles, more irregular verbs)
- better understand Korean culture and values.
- become more effective inter-cultural communicators.

Lesson Test: There are a total of 11 tests. Each test will be administered at the end of each lesson. Each test is worth 3% of your final grade. .

Final Exam:	The goal of the final exam is to test your overall understanding of the Korean language skills taught through this course. The two hour exam will be scheduled during the regular exam period in April. All lessons from the textbook will be covered.
Vocabulary Quiz:	Every time a new lesson is introduced, the students will have a very short vocabulary quiz based on the second hour of each lesson.
Oral Presentation:	This oral test will constitute 4% of the students' overall grade. Format and topics of the presentation will be announced in class.
Attendance:	Unexcused absences will be deducted from the attendance mark (0.5% deduction for each absence). In case of emergency, students are expected to inform the instructor of their absence in advance.
Assignments:	All assignments are due at the beginning of class. The ordinary classroom assignment is to submit the workbook that comes with the textbook. Please note that the workbook submission is due in the classroom hours prior to each lesson test. The marked workbook can be picked up in the department office (UC 115) a day after you submit the workbook. Besides the workbook submission, the students will be assigned other homework in class (e.g. composition, journal). Assignments will be marked in A (good), B (pass) C (incomplete, insincere, copied). No late assignments will be accepted.
Reading Task	This is to help the students with their pronunciation, word spacing and overall fluency in the language. The students will go to the computer lab and record a few randomly selected reading passages from the textbook.
Role-play	The students will be given a topic (chosen at random from a pool) and asked to carry a short conversation with their partner(s).

Policies for a Make-up Test

In case that the students miss class due to an emergency situation, a make-up test will be provided. However, each student is only allowed to take only ONE make-up test for a missed test, and ONE make-up test for a missed vocabulary quiz during the entire school year (2008-09). Further missed quizzes/tests will result in a score of 0 on those quizzes/tests. Also, the student is responsible for arranging the make-up test with the instructor. Those who need to write a make-up test are expected to inform the instructor in advance that they will be unable to attend, and must write the make-up test before the quiz or vocabulary test in question is returned to the class.

Words of Wisdom

- Listen to the audio materials (vocabulary and dialogue) *every day*
- Learn vocabulary relevant to your daily life. If you want to check if you have mastered the vocabulary see if you can catch the meanings of the words by listening to them repeated back to you, then put it aside for a few hours and try again. Concentrate on the words that you can't recall. Use vocabulary in a sentence. If you don't know how to use a word in a sentence get help from your Korean friends or a teacher.
- Try to study a little every day
- Seek opportunities to talk with people who speak Korean as their first language.
- Don't be afraid of making mistakes in class
- Be positive
- Have fun

Prerequisite: Korean 1030 or grade 12U Korean or the former OAC Korean or Korean 002, or permission of the Department.

Antirequisite: None
