Snowsnake



Come and try your hand at throwing a specially prepared "snow-snake" down a snow track in this challenging and competitive First Nation's sport

played for over 500 years!

Teams work to have their snowsnakes go the fastest and furthest. Snowsnakes are 6 feet long and records show them travelling up to 1.5 miles! The track is made by piling snow about 30 inches high and sloping it to ground level. A log is used to make a groove along the top of the track for the snowsnakes to travel.
