Dr. Papsin, a full-time pediatric otolaryngologist at The Hospital for Sick Children since July 1996, trained in otolaryngology (University of Toronto) and completed a pediatric otolaryngology fellowship (Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children, London, England). He has a MSc in Psychoacoustics. Dr. Papsin's clinical focus is the surgical rehabilitation of hearing loss; he runs the bone-anchored hearing aid and auricular prosthesis programs. His clinical activities also include sinonasal disease in children with cystic fibrosis. He is a member of the Research Institute and runs a laboratory in which studies are focused on the growth and development of the auditory system after cochlear implantation.
