

FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENTS-ORIENTATION (updated May 2010)

RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. All patients of Obstetricians or Family doctors presenting to the labour and delivery suite. All complex patients in the DR should be made known to the senior. (ie. Breech, twins, possible midforceps, severe pre-eclamptic)
2. All patients presenting to the emergency room with gynecological problems. All patients presenting to the ER should be presented first to the senior or gyne resident.
3. All patients on the post -partum and antenatal floor. Please round on all antenatal patients, all C/S patients and any vaginal deliveries you were involved in. On the weekends please round before leaving or ensure that the incoming resident will see those patients. They are to be supervised by the senior OB/GYN resident and the attending consultant or family practitioner.

ATTENDANCE REQUIRED AT:

1. Teaching sessions see calendar. Expectation is that you attend even if post call.
2. All Friday am Women's Health Clinic, by one resident from 9-12am. Please coordinate who goes to this clinic ahead of schedule according to call and holidays. Tuesday - Please go over test results in Women's Health Clinic.
3. All Wednesday am citywide rounds. (Schedule in lounge)
4. All Friday am OB/GYN rounds on the 7th floor Westminster Tower.
5. GENERAL OB/GYN CLINICS HELD MONDAY - FRIDAY 9-12am & 1-4pm.
6. Residents who have finished the rotation feeling the most fulfilled with goals met are those that have sought learning opportunities. There is always something going on. We welcome your involvement.

DISCUSSION POINTS

1. Outside Calls, Transfers- Please refer anyone wishing to transfer a patient to our hospital to the consultant on call.
2. Discharging Patients-Please speak with the Consultant or resident before discharging a patient.
