

Canada Research Chair  
Building Sustainable Value

The **Richard Ivey School of Business** at **The University of Western Ontario** invites applications for a Tier 1 Canada Research Chair tenured Professor appointment in the area of **Building Sustainable Value**.

The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. in business or management. Applicants must demonstrate an exemplary research and publication record in business sustainability, as well as exhibit enthusiasm for, and excellence in teaching business sustainability at the undergraduate, MBA, and doctoral levels. The successful applicant will have a proven track record in securing major grants, demonstrated proficiency in managing a research centre, collaborating with academic colleagues across disciplines within a business school and across faculties within a university, as well as interfacing with the corporate and public sectors on business sustainability. Demonstrated experience leading multidisciplinary, multi-sectoral research teams with corporate and government partners would be advantageous.

The position entails doctoral level graduate teaching and supervision, as well as curriculum development related to business sustainability. The candidate will be expected to lead the Centre for Building Sustainable Value and generate research interest and improve research impact in business sustainability at Ivey. The Centre's vision is to have the Ivey Business School recognized as a global leader in sustainability research and teaching and a major force for positive change.

The **Richard Ivey School of Business** is recognized worldwide for the quality of its management education and research. The School's major activities include: a highly regarded MBA program and undergraduate program; a well established doctoral program active in most major areas of management; as well as, an expanding portfolio of programs for executives, including an Executive MBA delivered in Canada and Hong Kong. The Canadian Executive MBA facilities are located at the Exchange Tower in downtown Toronto. The Asia campus is located at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Center.

All positions are subject to budget approval. Applicants must have fluent written and oral communication skills in English. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be given priority. The Richard Ivey School of Business and The University of Western Ontario are committed to employment equity and welcome applications from all qualified women and men, including visible minorities, aboriginal people and persons with disabilities.
