Candidates should have an established professional career, experience as a studio teacher at the university level, and a grounding in current performance research. A doctoral degree or equivalent is the expected academic background. While recruitment and studio instruction at the graduate and undergraduate levels are the primary responsibilities, the ability to offer courses and supervise research in the MMus and DMA programs is highly desirable.

The successful candidate must be prepared to balance ongoing professional commitments with a strong profile in teaching, performance, performance research, and committee work at the Don Wright Faculty of Music.

Letter of application, a comprehensive curriculum vitae, and a DVD containing video clips of at least two recent performances as well as a fifteen-minute clip of private teaching at an advanced level should be sent to the following address. Three letters of reference indicating first-hand knowledge of the candidate's teaching and research abilities should be forwarded under separate cover. Additional material may be requested later.
