ACADEMIC POSITION - DIVISION OF NEPHROLOGY

The Department of Medicine, Division of Nephrology, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at The University of Western Ontario, and its affiliated hospitals are seeking a Nephrologist for a full-time clinical academic appointment to The University of Western Ontario. Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification in Nephrology, by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD or equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario.

The Division of Nephrology currently consists of 16 academic Nephrology educator/researchers. The new position will be primarily located at the University Hospital site, where there are at present 8 full-time academic Nephrologists. Applicants for this position will have a commitment to, and demonstrated aptitude for, clinical research. Approximately 50% of the successful applicant's time will be protected for research, teaching and other academic activities. The successful candidate will be expected to teach at the Undergraduate and Graduate level, and supervise Graduate trainees. The candidate will also be expected to take a full role in the clinical activities carried out by the Nephrology Program. Preference will be given to applicants with advanced training or experience in clinical research and renal transplantation.

The University of Western Ontario is situated in picturesque London, Ontario, a city of approximately 340,000 along the banks of the Thames River. The City of London is a vibrant community with many family-friendly amenities and has one of the lowest cost of living rates in Ontario.
