

## **MOLECULAR VIROLOGY FACULTY POSITION**

The Department of Microbiology and Immunology is seeking a probationary (tenure-track) faculty member at the level of Assistant or Associate Professor in the area of Molecular Virology. Outstanding candidates will be considered at a higher rank. The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. degree, M.D., or equivalent and is expected to establish an independent, externally funded research program and collaborations with others at the University, the Robarts Research Institute, and the Lawson Health Research Institute. The Department has strong research programs in the areas of autoimmunity and diabetes, transplantation, viral immunology and molecular microbiology. Priority will be given to candidates with research interests and expertise in viral pathogenesis and viral-mediated immune modulation which will complement existing areas of research strength within the Department and the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry. The successful candidate will also be expected to participate in the teaching programs of the Department at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

With a full-time enrolment of about 32,000 The University of Western Ontario is a research-intensive university that graduates students from a full range of academic and professional programs. The Department of Microbiology and Immunology has 23 full time faculty members, numerous cross and joint appointed faculty in basic and clinical departments and at research institutes.
