The Department of Paediatrics, Children's Hospital, London Health Sciences Centre, The University of Western Ontario, London Ontario, Canada, is seeking a fully certified Paediatric Infectious Diseases (ID) Specialist with a focus on infection control. The successful candidate will hold a full time clinical academic appointment; salary and rank will be determined by experience and qualifications at the time of appointment. Candidates must hold an MD and be eligible for licensing in the Province of Ontario. Specialist certification in Paediatrics and Infectious Diseases through the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or equivalent is required. Assistance will be available for immigration and licensing requirements, if applicable.

Children's Hospital is the only tertiary care centre between Toronto and Winnipeg, serving a population of over 500,000 children and youth. The ID program has a comprehensive array of services encompassing the full spectrum of paediatric infectious diseases, infection control and a clinical research program. The candidate must have demonstrated a strong interest in infection control. The ID program is very active in undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing medical education. The Department of Paediatrics in London has 65 full time academic physicians, 7 basic scientists and 10 community physicians providing a full array of Paediatric sub-specialty services. Children's Hospital has 64 general paediatric beds, 12 intensive care beds, 42 neonatal beds and an extremely active emergency department. Opportunities exist for clinical and basic science research including epidemiological studies, health outcomes research, or basic science research through our microbiology department.

London has a population of 465,000 people with the amenities of a big city but friendliness of a small town. London is located in the heart of the great lakes region, 2 hours from Toronto and Detroit.
