The Department of Pathology, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at The University of Western Ontario, and its affiliated hospitals is seeking an Anatomical Pathologist for full-time appointment to The University of Western Ontario. Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification, in Anatomical or General Pathology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD or equivalent degree, and must be eligible for Licensure by The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. Rank will be determined by experience and qualifications at the time of appointment.

This position is aimed at a candidate with a strong research interest and background. Time will be divided approximately equally between research and clinical duties. It is expected that the successful candidate will run an independent research program with external funding in basic clinical or translational pathology. Appropriate resources for start-up will be provided. Ultimately the candidate should be willing to assume a leadership role in departmental research activities and to mentor junior faculty in research endeavours. The successful candidate will also participate in the clinical work of the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at London Health Sciences Centre. Developed subspecialty interest and expertise in breast, head and neck or soft tissue pathology would be considered an asset. Alternatively the candidate should be willing to develop expertise in one of these areas. Appropriate teaching at the undergraduate, graduate or postgraduate level will be expected. The salary and benefit package is competitive and attractive.

The London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC) is one of Canada's largest acute care teaching hospitals, and encompasses University Hospital, Victoria Hospital and Children's Hospital. The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine is one of the largest departments in Canada, with an annual workload of approximately 50,000 surgical specimens, 30,000 cytology specimens and 550 autopsies.
