Each person will accept to share, equally, classroom instruction, assessment of the academic work of students, proctoring the final exam, maintenance of regular office hours, and all the other ancillary duties normally associated with undergraduate teaching.

Please note offerings could be assigned to the workload of full-time faculty or to part-time faculty with seniority or preference rights in accordance with the Collective Agreement, or left unfilled based on operational/enrolment requirements.

Candidates must have competence appropriate to the course(s) for which application is being made and a demonstrated record of successful performance in teaching. In accordance with the Collective Agreement, consideration of applicants will include an assessment of previous performance, experience, and qualifications pertinent to the position, among which performance (as demonstrated by teaching evaluations or letters of recommendation) will be given a priority.

Candidates must be willing to undertake training as required by the Employer including, but not limited to, training in respect of health and safety, harassment and discrimination, and legislated service standards.
