Candidates for theoretical course teaching must hold a Master degree in Nursing (PhD preferred) and CNO licence to practice. Candidates for clinical teaching positions must hold a baccalaureate degree in Nursing (Master degree in Nursing preferred), CNO licence to practice, and relevant clinical teaching experience. Candidates for graduate courses (9606, 9664) must hold an earned doctorate (PhD) and CNO licence to practice, preferably in the Extended Class.

In accordance with the Collective Agreement, consideration of applicants will include an assessment of previous performance, experience, and qualifications, including qualifications which go beyond the requirements for the position.

Candidate must be willing to undertake training as required by the Employer including, but not limited to, training in respect of health and safety, harassment and discrimination, and legislated service standards.
