1. **New Awards and Scholarships**

The following have been approved by the Property and Finance Committee on behalf of the Board of Governors:

HBA '74 Scholarships (Richard Ivey School of Business)

Awarded to full-time HBA students at the Richard Ivey School of Business, based on academic achievement and demonstrated community leadership. Applications for these scholarships must be submitted to the HBA Programs Office by January 31. The HBA Scholarship Committee will make the final selection of the recipients. These scholarships were made possible by gifts from the Class of HBA '74.

Number and Value: 5 at \$5,000

Effective Date: 2008-2009 to 2012-2013 academic years inclusive

Cogeco Inc. Ontario Graduate Scholarship (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Information and Media Studies)

Awarded to a graduate student in the Faculty of Information and Media Studies who is a current holder of an Ontario Graduate Scholarship, based on academic achievement (minimum 78% average) and research merit. The Faculty of Graduate Studies will select the recipient in consultation with the Dean of the Faculty of Information and Media Studies. This scholarship is made possible by a generous gift from Cogeco Inc.

Value: 1 at \$15,000

Effective: 2007-2008 only

Jack Cowin Football Scholarships (Any Undergraduate, Graduate or Affiliated University College Student - Athletic Award [Football])

Awarded to full-time undergraduate and graduate students in any year of any degree program at Western, including the Affiliated University Colleges, who are making a significant contribution as members of the Men's Football Team. As per OUA and CIS regulations, an entering student athlete must have a minimum admission average of 80% and a non-entering student must have an in-course average of 70%. Candidates must be in compliance with current OUA and CIS regulations. The Western Athletic Financial Awards Committee will select the recipients based on its evaluation of academic performance/potential (20%) and the written recommendations from the Head Coach assessing athletic performance/potential and team/campus leadership (weighted as 60% and 20% respectively). These scholarships were established by Dr. Cowin (BA '64).

Value: 2 at \$3,500

Effective: 2008-2009 to 2011-2012 academic years inclusive

Bizmo Award for Volunteerism (Faculty of Engineering)

Awarded to an undergraduate student in the third or fourth year of an Engineering program (minimum 70% average) who has demonstrated outstanding volunteer and leadership skills through participation in the Undergraduate Engineering Society and/or involvement in extracurricular activities that are focused on enhancing the Western campus or the broader community. Applications can be obtained from the Faculty of Engineering and must be submitted, along with a one-page statement describing the applicant's volunteer activities, by September 30. The Faculty of Engineering will select the recipient. This award is made possible by a gift from Joseph and Janet Smolders in recognition of their son, Bill Smolders, BEng '07, who was the 2006 UES President.

Claude Lamoureux HBA Scholarships (Richard Ivey School of Business)

Awarded to full-time HBA students at the Richard Ivey School of Business based on academic achievement (minimum 80% average) and demonstrated community leadership. Preference will be given to students who have graduated from a publicly-funded high school. Applications for these scholarships must be submitted to the HBA Programs Office by January 31. The HBA Scholarship Committee will make the final selection of the recipients. These scholarships were made possible by gifts from Claude Lamoureux's friends and colleagues through Foundation Western, in recognition of Claude's commitment to excellence.

Value: 5 at \$10,000, 2008-2009 academic year inclusive

Claude Lamoureux MBA Health Sector Awards (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Business Administration)

Awarded to full-time students entering the Master of Business Administration Program at the Richard Ivey School of Business, based on academic achievement, demonstrated community leadership and financial need. Applications for these awards must be submitted to the MBA Program Office by October 31. Final selection of recipients will be made by the MBA Scholarship Committee (with at least one representative of the Committee being a member of the Faculty of Graduate Studies), following an assessment of financial need by Ivey's Director of Financial Aid. Recipients must meet the Ontario residency requirements of the Ontario Trust for Student Support Program. These awards were made possible by gifts from Claude Lamoureux's friends and colleagues through Foundation Western in recognition of Claude's commitment to excellence.

Value: 2 at \$15,000
Effective: 2009-2010 academic year

Note: This portion of the Donors' gift qualifies for the Ontario Trust for Student Support (OTSS) program, which will provide a dollar for dollar match for endowed gifts directed to student bursaries or financial need based awards and scholarships. Recipients must meet Ontario residency requirements.

HBA 1957 Scholarship (Richard Ivey School of Business)

Awarded to a student entering HBA 1 or HBA 2 at the Richard Ivey School of Business based on academic achievement and demonstrated community leadership. Applications for this scholarship must be submitted to the HBA Programs Office by January 31. The HBA Scholarship Committee will make the final selection of the recipient. This award was made possible by gifts from the HBA Class of 1957 through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$2,000
Effective: 2008-2009 academic year

Dennis Logan Award (Any Undergraduate Faculty)

Awarded to an undergraduate student entering first year of any degree program with a minimum admission average of 80%, who demonstrates financial need. Online financial award applications are available through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and must be submitted by October 31. The Office of the Registrar will select the recipient. This award was established by Dennis Logan (BA '67) through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$500
Effective: 2008-2009 academic year

This award is offered through the Ontario Student Opportunity Trust Fund (OSOTF) program, and recipients

must meet Ontario residency requirements.

Concentric Associates International Inc. Award (Faculty of Engineering)

Awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in third or fourth year of the Civil Engineering program who has achieved a minimum 75% average, is enrolled in a concurrent degree program, is involved in extracurricular activities, and has demonstrated financial need. In addition to this award, Concentric Associates will offer the recipient a work term with their company. Applications can be obtained from the Faculty of Engineering and must be submitted along with a short statement outlining academic interests and involvement in extracurricular activities by September 30. The recipient will be selected by the Scholarships and Awards Committee in the Faculty of Engineering after the Registrar's Office has assessed financial need. Online financial need applications are available through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and are also due by September 30. This award was established by a generous gift from Concentric Associates International Inc.

The value of the award will be \$1,500 for the 2008-2009 to the 2012-2013 academic years, inclusive. After this time, the value of the award will be determined based on the income available through the endowed fund, which is expected to be a minimum of \$1,125.

Mature Student Advisor Bursary (Any Undergraduate Faculty)

Awarded to a part-time or full-time undergraduate student in any year of any undergraduate degree program who was admitted to Western as a Mature Applicant and who has demonstrated financial need. Applications can be accessed online through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and must be submitted by October 31. The Registrar's Office will select the recipient. This award was established by Donna Moore (MEd'86), a valued employee of Western and a long-term Mature Student Advisor.

Value: 1 at \$1,000

Effective: 2008-2009 academic year

StarTech.com Awards (Faculty of Social Science, Management and Organizational Studies)

Awarded to full-time students entering their third year of the Bachelor of Management and Organizational Studies Program (BMOS), with the highest modular averages (minimum 75%), registered in the Specialization in Organizational & Human Resources, Major in Management and Organizational Studies or Major in Organization and Human Resources. Applications are available at the MOS Office and must be submitted along with a one-page statement outlining accomplishments and career interests by September 30. Should two or more students have the same average, preference will be given to a student residing in Southwestern Ontario, who in the opinion of the committee, submitted the best one-page statement. The award will continue into fourth year as long as the recipient maintains a 75% average. If a recipient fails to retain the award, another third-year student will be selected. The recipients will be selected by the Scholarship and Awards Committee within MOS. These awards were established by StarTech.com Ltd.

Value: 2 at \$2,500

Effective: 2008-2009 to 2012-2013 academic years inclusive

Beryl Ivey Continuing Entrance Award (Any Undergraduate Faculty)

Awarded to a Canadian (or permanent resident) secondary school student entering the first year of any first-entry undergraduate program, based on financial need and academic achievement (minimum 90% admission average). This prestigious entrance award also recognizes a candidate's engagement in a range of extra-curricular activities such as the arts and athletics, as well as community service through contributions to school and community life.

To be considered for this award, candidates should follow the application process established for the award, which includes an application, a one-page statement written by the candidate on how his or her activities contribute to his or her home or school communities and impact the lives of others, and a letter of nomination from his or her school principal or a teacher. A Financial Assistance Application and supplemental information will be required. Applications and all supporting documentation must be received at Western by February 14.

The Office of the Registrar will consult with faculties in the selection process. A new first-year recipient will be selected each year. If similarly qualified students apply, the student with the greatest financial need will be selected. This award will continue for a maximum of four years provided the recipient maintains a 70% average on a minimum 5.0 course load or full course load as defined by the faculty. Should a student fail to retain the award, the award will become available to a similarly qualified student in the same year for the remainder of the initial four-year period.

This award was established through the Estate of Beryl Ivey, BA '47, through Foundation Western. Beryl Ivey was a well-known Canadian philanthropist and generous member of the London community who provided guidance and support to Western throughout her lifetime.

The recipient must have demonstrated community leadership and entrepreneurial spirit, and be a well-rounded individual with excellent communications skills. The recipient will have expressed an interest in a career in Accounting and in obtaining the CA designation. The award will be promoted by Career Management to all first-year HBA students in November, and the recipient will be selected in December by the HBA Scholarship and Awards Committee. To be eligible, a student will have obtained an academic standing in the top 10% of the law school class. Additional selection criteria may include financial need, membership in a historically disadvantaged group as outlined by the Ontario Human Rights Commission, involvement in the community, participation in extracurricular activities in the University or at the Law School, and whether a student has multiple responsibilities and limited support. The award will continue into third year if the recipient's second year average places him or her in the top 20% of their class for that year. Applications can be obtained from the Student Services Office of the Law School and must be completed by June 30 of the end of the student's first year. The Dean of the Faculty of Law will make the final selection. This scholarship was established by a generous gift from Blake Cassels & Graydon, LLP.

Value: 1 at \$5,000

To: Awarded to second-year Law students who demonstrate academic excellence in the first year of their law studies. To be eligible, a student will have obtained an academic standing in the top 10% of the law school class and demonstrated financial need. Additional selection criteria may include: membership in a historically disadvantaged group, as outlined by the Ontario Human Rights Commission; involvement in the community; participation in extracurricular activities at the University or the Law School; and, whether the student has multiple responsibilities and limited support. The award will continue into third year if the recipient's second year average places him or her in the top 20% of the class for that year and he or she continues to demonstrate financial need. Candidates must complete an online financial need application through the Office of the Registrar's Web site, in addition to completing an application form through the Student Services Office of the Law School (both of which are due October 31). The Registrar's Office will assess financial need and the Faculty of Law will make the final selection. This scholarship was established by a generous gift from Blake Cassels & Graydon, LLP.

Final selection will be made by the Nursing Scholarships and Awards Committee. This award was made possible by the generous donations of family and friends in memory of Alfreda Simons Kartha, a distinguished faculty member in the School of Nursing.

To: Awarded annually to a student entering second, third or fourth year of Nursing in the Faculty of Health Sciences, who has demonstrated academic achievement and who most reflects Professor Kartha's warmth, compassion, and interest in gerontology and chronic illness. Self-nominated or faculty-nominated candidates must submit a letter of application with a resume and supporting documentation to the Chair of the Nursing Scholarships and Awards Committee by March 15. Final selection will be made by the Nursing Scholarships and Awards Committee. This award was made possible by the generous donations of family and friends in memory of Alfreda Simons Kartha, a distinguished faculty member in the School of Nursing, and is held at Foundation Western.

Faculty of Health Sciences Clinical Education Placement Travel Support Bursaries

The Faculty of Health Sciences has revised the following criteria to remove limitations stipulated in the May 2008 report to the Board which referred to a maximum of \$400. This award will be funded from the Faculty's Operating funds.

Revised to: Students in the Schools of Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Communication Sciences and Disorders, Kinesiology, and the Bachelor of Health Sciences program, incur costs for living and travel expenses beyond the norm as a result of their participation in clinical placements that are an integral part of their academic programs. The intent of the bursaries is to support students who are completing clinical placements outside of the City of London. Students will have the opportunity to apply for a one-time award per budget year (May 1 - April 30) to help offset these costs. The bursaries are intended to offset *some* of the *additional* costs that occur when students do not receive placements in London and are required to travel outside of the city. They can also help to offset placement expenses that occur when students are required to use their vehicles within a placement, and incur expenses in excess of those that occur during routine travel to and from a placement site. Students can apply for a *Clinical Education Placement Travel Support Bursary* for any clinical education placement expenses that meet the criteria below for placements that occur within the time frame of May 1 to April 30. Students cannot apply for expenses that have been covered already by other grants or programs.

Criteria: Students can complete the form to apply for support under one or more of the following:

1. A student absorbs two housing costs (i.e., a student continues to pay for London-area housing and can demonstrate payment for other housing in the placement location).
2. Commuting distances to a placement location exceed 60 km daily (e.g., students commuting to St. Thomas, Stratford, Chatham, or Sarnia for placement), or there is a need to use a personal vehicle for community or home visits that are included as part of placement responsibilities.
3. One-time travel expenses for air, rail, or auto transportation required to reach a distant placement

location.

4. Special placement-specific travel expenses (e.g., a student is required to purchase additional vehicle insurance for the duration of a placement, or must rent a vehicle in order to complete the placement).

Note: Each School and Program will distribute its allotted funds to eligible students as it deems appropriate.
