- 1.** For admission to the module, completion of first year requirements with no failures is required. Students must have an average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses, including 0.5 course Writing 1000F/G; 1.0 course from English 1020E, 1022E, 1024E, 1035E, 1036E, and both 1027F/G and 1028F/G or permission of the Department; and 1.0 course from Classical Studies 1000, Comparative Literature 1020, Film 1020E, French 1900E, Philosophy 1020, Visual Arts History 1040, Visual Arts Studio 1020, or Women's Studies 1020E; and 0.5 additional course. A minimum mark of 70% in Writing 1000F/G is required, with no mark below 60% in the other principal courses. In addition, a portfolio must be submitted.

- Cover should indicate name and Western ID
- Table of Contents
- Personal Statement
- Statement should not exceed 250 keyboarded words
- Statement should include creative interests, influences, and goals
- Four works demonstrating a range of genres. If the work is an excerpt of a longer work, please provide a brief written context for the excerpt.
- Digital .doc file or PDF

Portfolio Evaluation Criteria

The focus of the Honors Specialization in Creative Writing and English Language and Literature is on creative and critical approaches to contemporary creative writing practices in a variety of literary genres such as poetry, fiction, creative non-fiction, literary journalism, screenwriting, and playwriting. Academic essays will not be considered.

The adjudicators will be looking for writing that demonstrates an ability to communicate original creative ideas both technically and conceptually in relation to the genre in which the work is situated.

The work adjudicated for potential acceptance will be chosen on the basis of the originality of ideas, language, and voice; the range of writing ability and explorations; the depth and breath of literary engagement; and the technical quality of the writing.
