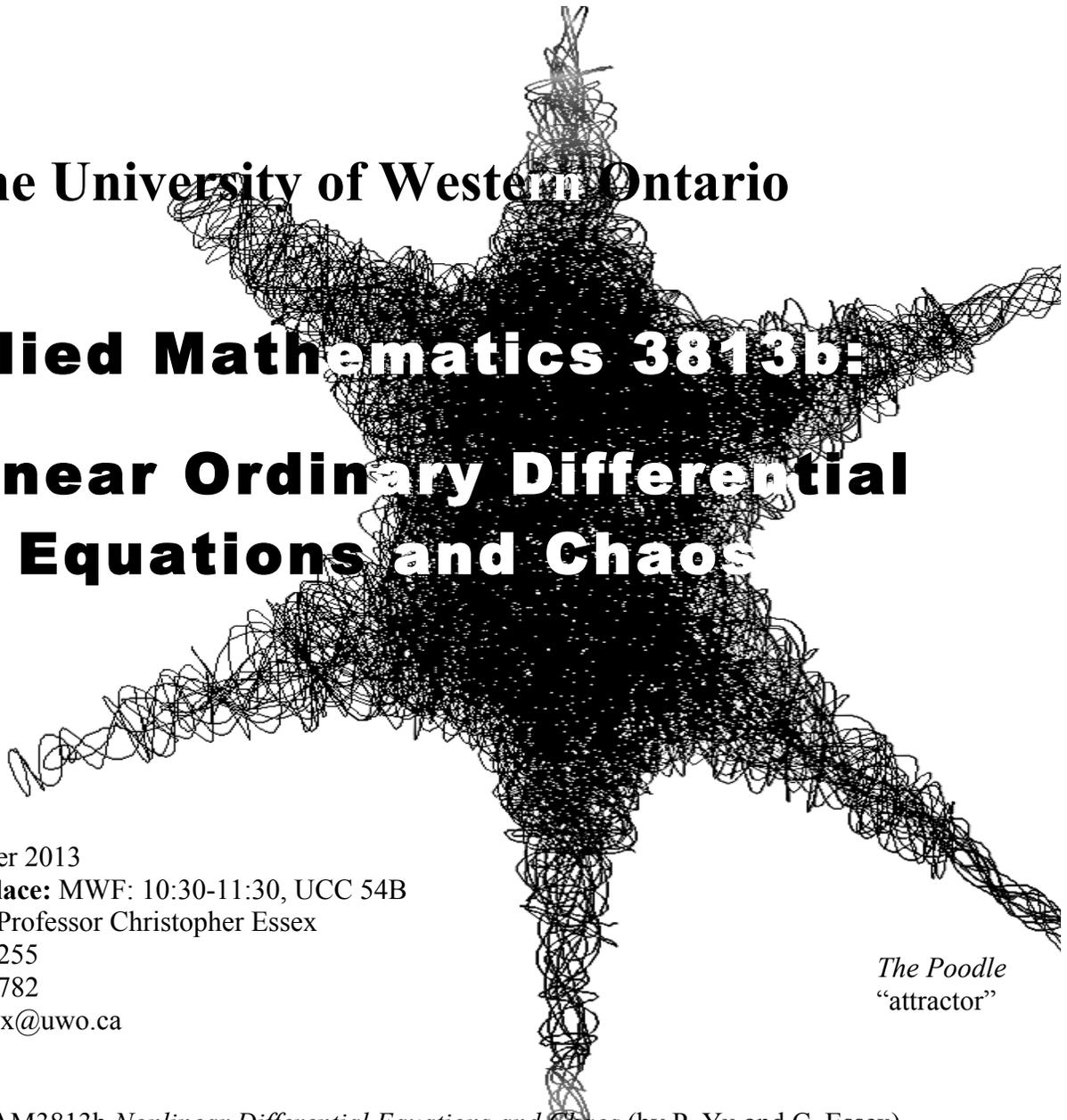

Course Evaluation
