Being an Archaeologist in a Fine Arts Museum: Scientific and Ethical Challenges of Working with Unprovenienced Collections

Dr. Erell Hubert is curator of pre-Columbian art at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts. She holds a Ph.D in Archaeology from the University of Cambridge. Her fieldwork-based research explores the role of material culture in processes of identity negotiation in pre-Hispanic colonial contexts along the north coast of Peru. At the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, she was associate curator of the exhibition Peru: Kingdoms of the Sun and the Moon presented in 2013 and was co-curator of the Arts of One World new permanent galleries which opened in November 2019, overseeing, among others, the galleries devoted to the arts of Latin America.

Winter Student Donation Fund Applications




Do you have a cool project idea that needs funding? The SDF is an opportunity for Arts and Humanities students to receive funding for projects that benefits the Western A&H community.
