Therefore, your final exam will weigh 70% of your overall grade. You will not receive accommodation for missed midterm without proper documentation from Dean's office. Writing the midterm is not optional, you MUST have a valid reason to miss the midterm exam. The final exam is cumulative, meaning that it will cover course material from the beginning to the end of the course (July 29-Aug 16, 2019). *Make-up final exam is only available to students who have*

been granted accommodation by the Dean's office. You MUST have an authorized valid reason in order to receive exemption from missing the original final exam. *Please note that the make-up final exam will be tougher than the original final exam in order to maintain fairness in the course.* Students that are writing the make-up final have an advantage point because the exam questions will be out, they will have a very good idea of the instructor's style of testing for that particular year. They will also have more time to study the material. For these reasons, it is important to make the make-up final *tougher* in order to keep all students on *fair* ground.
