The [Faculty of Health Sciences](#) at Western University seeks a dedicated educator to join our leading edge [Arthur Labatt Family School of Nursing](#). With over a 100-year history of academic and research excellence, the School is one of seven in a progressive Faculty, offering academic programs in nursing at undergraduate, masters, and doctoral levels.

This is a 2-year Limited-Term position. Compensation and rank (Lecturer or Assistant Professor) will be commensurate with educational qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will support the continuing evidence-based development and delivery of the Nurse Practitioner (NP) graduate program according to curriculum needs as well as the undergraduate programs in nursing. Responsibilities will include classroom teaching and service to the School, Faculty, University, and profession as appropriate.

The successful candidate will have a thorough understanding and demonstrated application of adult learning principles; a learner-centered philosophy of teaching, learning, and evaluation; teaching experience at the undergraduate and graduate levels; recent nursing practice; and clinical teaching experience. The successful applicant will also have a demonstrated capacity to contribute substantively to an inclusive and diverse academic community. Knowledge and expertise in teaching and learning in flexible learning and simulated learning environments are assets. Applicants will be Registered Nurses in the extended class (NPs) and hold a current license entitling them to practice with no restrictions with the College of Nurses of Ontario. The minimum educational requirement for this position is a Master's degree in Nursing.

Western, like many postsecondary institutions in Canada, is moving beyond the sole reliance upon Indigenous self-identification in hiring designated Indigenous roles to safeguard against use of incorrect, incomplete, or misleading information regarding claims of Indigenous identity.
