

## Probationary (Tenure-Track) Position, Philosophy, Western University

Western University's Department of Philosophy seeks to hire a Probationary (tenure-track) Assistant Professor with a specialization in ethics, feminist philosophy, or political philosophy. We welcome candidates who take historical or contemporary approaches in their research. In addition to specializing in one or more of the above areas, candidates must have a competence in the ethics of artificial intelligence.

The successful candidate will be expected to conduct research in their area(s) of expertise and to teach undergraduate and graduate courses, some of which will focus on AI ethics. Western University has a semester system, and the position comes with a 2-2 teaching load. The anticipated start date is July 1, 2023.

With annual research funding exceeding \$220 million, and an international reputation for success, Western ranks as one of Canada's top research-intensive universities. We are dedicated to promoting diversity, equity, inclusion, and decolonization in our discipline, research, and teaching.
