Nominations and applications are invited for the position of Chair of the Department of Political Science. Nominees and applicants must hold a tenured appointment at Western. The Chair appointment will be effective July 1, 2024, for a five year term, renewable.

The department seeks a scholar who is committed to high-quality teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The candidate should have a commitment to continuing the department's focus on generating impactful academic and policy-related research. In recent years, the Political Science Department has carved a niche for itself in political behaviour and methodology. The Department seeks a candidate who will continue on this trajectory, while also supporting the development of other departmental areas of strength. A candidate with a strong research record and administrative experience is preferred. The selected candidate is expected to show leadership in teaching, research and administration. Candidates are sought who have demonstrated skill in communication and transparency in making decisions, openness to the views of others, ability to articulate the significance of the study of political science for society, as well as fairness, integrity, and inclusiveness.
