



SCHULICH SCHOOL OF MEDICINE & DENTISTRY Full-Time, Limited Term Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine

The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Western University, invites applications for a full-time, teaching-intensive, limited term faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor. The initial appointment will be up to 5 years with the potential for renewal. Salary for this position will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Qualified applicants must have a PhD or equivalent in Pathology or a closely related biomedical science discipline. Formal training in education/pedagogy, or experience with course development and delivery would be considered an asset. The successful candidate will have primary responsibilities in the undergraduate Bachelor of Medical Science (BMSc) modules of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, as well as graduate education programs. The successful candidate will also be expected to take an active role in course delivery and development, student mentorship, and education-related administration within the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. The successful applicant must demonstrate excellent interpersonal, organizational and communication skills, and be able to work both independently and as part of a collaborative team.

The <u>Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine</u> is comprised of a basic science research department located at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Western University and a large clinical department located city-wide within the London hospitals. The Department has a strong commitment to undergraduate and graduate education. At the undergraduate level, the Department offers pathology courses and training to medical students, dental students, nursing students, and undergraduate students in the basic medical sciences, science and health sciences. At the graduate level, the Department offers a research-based MSc and PhD program in Pathology and Laboratory Medicine (including One Health), a MCISc Pathologists' Assistant program and a Graduate Diploma in Pathology.

With a full-time enrollment of about 35,000, Western University graduates students with a full range of academic and professional programs (www.uwo.ca to learn more). The university campus is in London, Ontario with a metropolitan census of 530,000, located midway between Toronto and Detroit. With parks, tree-lined streets and bicycle trails, London is known as the "Forest City". London boasts an international airport, galleries, theatre, music and sporting events.
