Position Profile:

The Department of Medicine, Division of Academic Hospital Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at Western University and London Health Sciences Centre and St. Joseph's Health Care London are seeking physicians for full-time clinical academic appointments to Western University. Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification, in Internal Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD, or equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO) in the province of Ontario

Academic and Clinical Expectations: The Division of Academic Hospital Medicine is seeking academic hospitalists to join a newly established Division within the Department of Medicine. The positions are open to physicians who hold, or are eligible for, Royal College certification in Internal Medicine, as well as Internal Medicine subspecialists who wish to focus their practice exclusively on internal medicine. The successful applicants will be appointed with an Academic Responsibility Category (ARC) of Clinician Teacher with teaching deliverables at the undergraduate level. Physicians in the Division are full members of the Department of Medicine Practice Plan.

Qualifications: Applicants for the Clinician Teacher academic positions must demonstrate a strong commitment to excellence in teaching and clinical education. They should have a clear record of involvement in medical education, including experience teaching learners at various stages such as medical students, residents, or fellows. The applicants must show evidence of educational effectiveness through (1) participation in formal training or coursework in medical education or teaching methodology; (2) a track record of high-quality teaching evaluations or demonstrated educational leadership; and (3) the ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues in designing and delivering educational experiences. Engagement in curriculum development, assessment strategies, or innovative educational initiatives in internal medicine will be considered an asset.

The successful candidates will provide care in the Division's inpatient services, working collaboratively with the Clinical Teaching Units, Subacute Medicine, and other specialty services, and will contribute to a 24/7 model of coverage for defined groups of admitted medical patients, including daytime inpatient attending coverage, overnight coverage, and ambulatory follow-up of recently discharged patients. The role is distinct in scope from General Internal Medicine and does not include GIM consultations, Pre-Admission Clinic, or supervision of GIM subspecialty trainees. Academic and hospital service expectations include a minimum of 50 hours of undergraduate teaching per year, membership on one Schulich/Western committee, and one quality improvement project or hospital committee membership. They will also be expected to provide high-quality teaching to medical students, residents, and fellows in both clinical and academic settings, contributing to the division's mission of excellence in education, patient-centered care, and scholarly advancement.

Compensation Details: Compensation for this position will be commensurate with qualifications and experience and will be primarily composed of the following sources: Fee for service (OHIP billings), academic salary, and specialty review funding.
