

**Oral Radiology – Assistant Professor (Tenure-Track)

Applications are invited from qualified individuals for a position in Oral Radiology at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry to begin on January 1, 2023, or as soon as possible thereafter. The successful candidate will be appointed in a Full-time Probationary (Tenure-Track) faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor. Highly qualified clinicians may be cross-appointed in the Department of Medical Imaging at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, with access to facilities at the affiliated teaching hospitals staffed by over 50 Medical Radiologists – London Health Sciences Centre, University Hospital, Victoria Hospital, and St. Joseph's Health Care. Candidates must possess a DDS/DMD degree (or equivalent) and have successfully completed a full-time, post-graduate program of at least 24 months duration in Oral Radiology. Candidates must be eligible for full or academic registration (licensure) as a dentist and/or specialist in Oral Radiology within the Province of Ontario, as stipulated by the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario (RCDSO).

Successful candidates should have a demonstrated aptitude for teaching and will be required to provide didactic lectures, pre-clinical instruction and clinical supervision of students enrolled in the undergraduate DDS and internationally trained dentists (ITD) programs at Western University. The successful candidate will be responsible for the design, development, and implementation of a comprehensive syllabus of Oral Radiology and Medical Imaging within the DDS and ITD programs. Additionally, the candidate will need to adapt to the current didactic and clinical curriculum of the program and will be expected to serve as a Course Director and effectively administer and deliver assigned courses. Candidates must have excellent oral and written communication skills in the English language and must be willing to work in a collaborative manner in all three areas of teaching, research, and administration. Compensation will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The opportunity for private practice is afforded by the provision of a consulting privilege of one day per week.
