



DIRECTOR, SCHOOL of OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

The Faculty of Health Sciences at Western University invites applications for the position of Director, School of Occupational Therapy. The School (uwo.ca/fhs/ot/) is seeking a visionary Director who will lead a dynamic group of researchers and instructors, and who will contribute meaningfully to the highly collaborative Leadership Team of the Faculty of Health Sciences (FHS). Along with demonstrated expertise in research, teaching, and leadership, the ideal candidate will have a track record as an excellent communicator, advocate, mentor, influencer, and strategic thinker. In addition to leading the School, the Director will have opportunities to be engaged in research and teaching activities, as appropriate. The term of the Director appointment is five years (renewable).

The selected candidate will be appointed to a tenured academic position at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, as determined by both experience and qualifications. The successful applicant will have a Ph.D., or equivalent, be registered or eligible for registration with the College of Occupational Therapists of Ontario (COTO), and show evidence of accomplished research, teaching, and leadership. The successful applicant will also have a demonstrated capacity to contribute substantively to an inclusive and diverse academic community. Having recently completed an extensive curriculum review, including launching a new occupation-focused curriculum with integrated attention to diversity, inclusion, equity, and decolonization, and displaying strong research success, including over 200 publications and \$3.5M in funding in the previous 5 years, we are looking for a progressive-thinking leader to expand upon the successes of the school. The anticipated start date of the appointment is **July 1, 2022**, or as negotiated. Salary commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The School of Occupational Therapy offers a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (MScOT) and participates in the FHS thesis-based graduate program in Health & Rehabilitation Sciences (HRS). The HRS Program was the first in Canada to host a combined clinical-research degree (i.e., MScOT-PhD). The School has established research strengths in relation to three pillars: (1) social justice; (2) social inclusion, and (3) health and well-being. Faculty members in the School are active and productive researchers, committed to developing new as well as expanding existing clinical training, community, and research partnerships with local, regional, national, and international interdisciplinary colleagues and stakeholders.

The Faculty is a large, diverse, and comprehensive unit. The Faculty delivers undergraduate programs in three areas and graduate programs in six disciplines, while offering a unique learning experience that enables students to develop a comprehensive understanding of health-related issues affecting people in all corners of the world. A spirit of collaboration has become part of the fabric of the Faculty and helps bring together world-class researchers and instructors from its six schools (Communication Sciences and Disorders, Health Studies, Kinesiology, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy; uwo.ca/fhs/schools/index.html).
