Position Profile: The Department of <u>Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation</u> at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at Western University and St. Joseph's Health Care London is seeking a full-time Physiatrist in the field of Stroke Rehabilitation (Clinician Researcher).

Qualifications: Candidates must hold an MD with certification in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and be licensed through the College of Physicians of Surgeons of Ontario. The successful candidate will be a Clinician Researcher with excellent clinical (stroke, MSK), communication, collaboration and research skills (collaborative and/or independent research capability), who is eligible to hold a full-time Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Professor.

The successful candidate will have an opportunity to work with a vibrant interdisciplinary stroke rehabilitation team in both inpatient and outpatient settings at Parkwood Institute, a specialized rehabilitation hospital in London, Ontario. Additionally, the successful candidate will have opportunities to engage in a robust stroke rehabilitation research network in London, the home of the internationally recognized Evidence Based Review in Stroke Rehabilitation (EBRSR), and to develop and drive stroke rehabilitation research projects in new and exciting directions.
