ACADEMIC POSITION – CHAIR/CHIEF DIVISION OF HEMATOLOGY

The Division of Hematology, Department of Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at Western University, and its affiliated Hospitals are seeking a Hematologist for a full-time clinical academic appointment to Western University as Chair/Chief of the Division. Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification, in Hematology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD, or equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario. The successful candidate will hold a continuing academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor depending on qualifications and experience.
