The Department of Medicine, within the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University, invites applications for a full-time probationary (tenure track) faculty position at the rank of Assistant or Associate in the field of Educational Assessment. The rank and salary will be commensurate with the successful applicant's qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will hold a cross-appointment in the Faculty of Education, Western University.

The successful candidate will hold a PhD or equivalent degree with advanced training in measurement and psychometrics or related areas, and will have a proven ability to think creatively to explore complex assessment issues in a range of clinical training settings. Therefore, experience in conducting research in naturalistic environments such as workplace based learning and big data (clinical and/or educational) will be considered an asset.

Applicants are expected to have an established track-record of scholarly work in educational assessment of medical trainees at any level of training. The successful candidate will have strong expertise in research design and data analysis, including advanced psychometric methodologies. Some understanding of qualitative methodologies is considered an asset. The successful candidate will demonstrate an aptitude for teaching and research with documented strong teaching and research abilities and a record of scholarly publication and attainment of peer-reviewed research grants. The candidate will mentor and supervise graduate students working in their area of expertise from The Centre for Education Research & Innovation (CERI)'s joint Master of Health Professional Education (MHPE) program, the Department of Medicine, and the Faculty of Education. The successful candidate will be expected to conduct their research in collaboration with research colleagues at the Centre for Education Research & Innovation (CERI), clinical educators in the Department of Medicine, educational leaders in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry and research colleagues from the Faculty of Education. The candidate will be based at the Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry Centre for Education Research & Innovation.

The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry's Centre for Education Research & Innovation is dedicated to fostering the discovery and application of knowledge obtained through high-calibre, programmatic research in Health Professional Education. Its vision is to build a community of education scientists and clinical collaborators across the clinical departments at Schulich, in order to advance educational and clinical practice through rigorous research inquiry.
