The Department of Physiology and Pharmacology within the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University is seeking a candidate for a full-time, Limited Term teaching-focused academic appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor. The initial appointment will be up to 5 years with the potential for renewal. Salary for this position will commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Qualified applicants must have a PhD or equivalent in Physiology and/or Pharmacology or a closely related discipline. A Masters of Education (MEd) or other formal training in education would be considered an asset. The successful candidate will be a full-time educator with responsibilities in the undergraduate programs in Physiology and/or Pharmacology, as well as medical and dental education programs. Duties will include lecturing in selected courses, being involved in laboratory teaching and curriculum development, and to undertake and demonstrate scholarship in education. Participation in Department education committees and involvement in academic counseling, outreach and student recruitment activities will also be expected. Candidates must have a strong record of teaching or the potential to excel in teaching at the undergraduate level. The successful applicant must demonstrate excellent interpersonal, organizational and communication skills, and be able to work both independently and as part of a collaborative team.

The Department of Physiology and Pharmacology is the largest basic medical science department in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry with over 80 associated faculty members, 70 graduate students, 20 postdoctoral fellows, and 35 staff.
