The Department of Medicine, within the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University, invites applications for a full-time probationary (tenure track) faculty position at the rank of Assistant or Associate or tenured position at the rank of Associate or Full Professor in the field Health Professions Education Research. The rank and salary will be commensurate with the successful applicant's qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will hold a cross-appointment in the Faculty of Education, Western University.

While candidates with robust programs of research in other educational domains will be considered, the ideal candidate will have a research program focused on educational assessment. The successful candidate will hold a PhD in a relevant field and will have a proven ability to think creatively to explore complex assessment issues in a range of clinical training settings. Advanced training in measurement and psychometrics, experience in conducting research in naturalistic environments, and/or experience with big data (clinical and/or educational) will be considered assets.

The ideal applicant will have an established track-record of scholarly work in educational assessment of medical trainees at any level of training. The successful candidate should have strong expertise in research design and data analysis, including advanced psychometric methodologies. Some understanding of qualitative methodologies is considered an asset. The successful candidate will demonstrate an aptitude for teaching and research with documented strong teaching and research abilities and a record of scholarly publication and attainment of peer-reviewed research grants. The candidate will mentor and supervise graduate students working in their area of expertise from The Centre for Education Research & Innovation (CERI)'s joint Master of Health Professional Education (MHPE) program, the Department of Medicine, and the Faculty of Education. The successful candidate will be expected to conduct their research in collaboration with research colleagues at the Centre for Education Research & Innovation (CERI), clinical educators in the Department of Medicine, educational leaders in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry and research colleagues from the Faculty of Education. The candidate will be based at the Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry Centre for Education Research & Innovation.

The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry's Centre for Education Research & Innovation is dedicated to fostering the discovery and application of knowledge obtained through high-calibre, programmatic research in Health Professional Education.
