



Intent to Register Family Studies & Human Development

Nursing

As a current Western student, you can “apply” to the nursing program(s) by completing the Intent to Register (ITR) process in March; there will be a Nursing-specific ITR link available at that time. Since this is a separate ITR application form, it will not impact ITR for your current program and/or your ability to apply to graduate. Adjudication will take place in May, and students will be notified of the status of their request once adjudication is complete.

Western-Fanshawe Collaborative BScN (4 YR)

- All students applying to the program must have completed the equivalent of the following Ontario high school courses with a minimum grade of 70% in each:
 - Grade 12 English (ENG4U)
 - Grade 12 Biology (SBI4U)
 - Grade 12 Chemistry (SCH4U)
 - One of: Grade 11 Functions and Applications (MCF3M) or Grade 11 Functions (MCR3U)

Admission averages are based on university coursework, with a minimum required average of 70% for consideration.

- If more than two years of study have been completed, the average will be calculated using the most recent 10 full-course equivalent credits.
- If fewer than 10 full-course equivalent credits, average will be calculated using all completed coursework.

Note: Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee acceptance.

Casper is not required

Compressed Time Frame BScN (19-month)

Current Western students requesting to transfer to the CTF program must meet *all* requirements *by the end of April*. Students completing requirements in the upcoming summer term are not eligible to apply by ITR for Fall 2025 (must apply through OUAC by February 15).

A minimum 75% average in the most recently completed 10.0 university credits.

- For applicants applying with only 10.0 credits, no more than 5.0 may be at the 1000-level.

Completion of the following prerequisite courses at the university level with a minimum grade of 60% in each:

1.0 credit in human physiology

0.5 credit in anatomy

0.5 credit in introductory statistics

Note: Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee acceptance.

What is Intent to Register?

- Intent to Register (ITR) is your opportunity to let Western know you will be returning the following year and what program/module you wish to be considered for.
- All 1st year students who plan to return to Western in the Fall need to fill out their ITR.
- Senior students who are making a change to their module(s) and/or program will also complete their ITR.
 - Senior students looking to continue in their current program do not need to complete ITR.

When is Intent to Register?

- **February 26th – April 2nd**

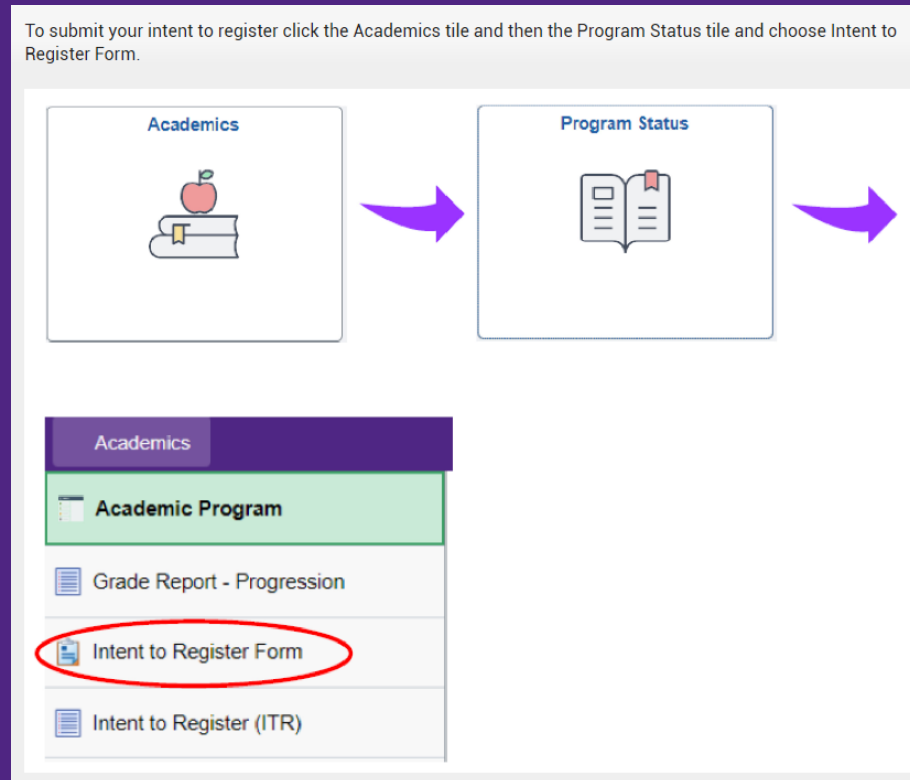
Timeline:

May – Family Studies & Human Development Academic Advising evaluates all academic work after final grades are posted (this process is called adjudication)

June - Find out which program you have been placed in by logging into your Student Centre

July - Select courses for next year (the specific date will be posted on your Student Centre)

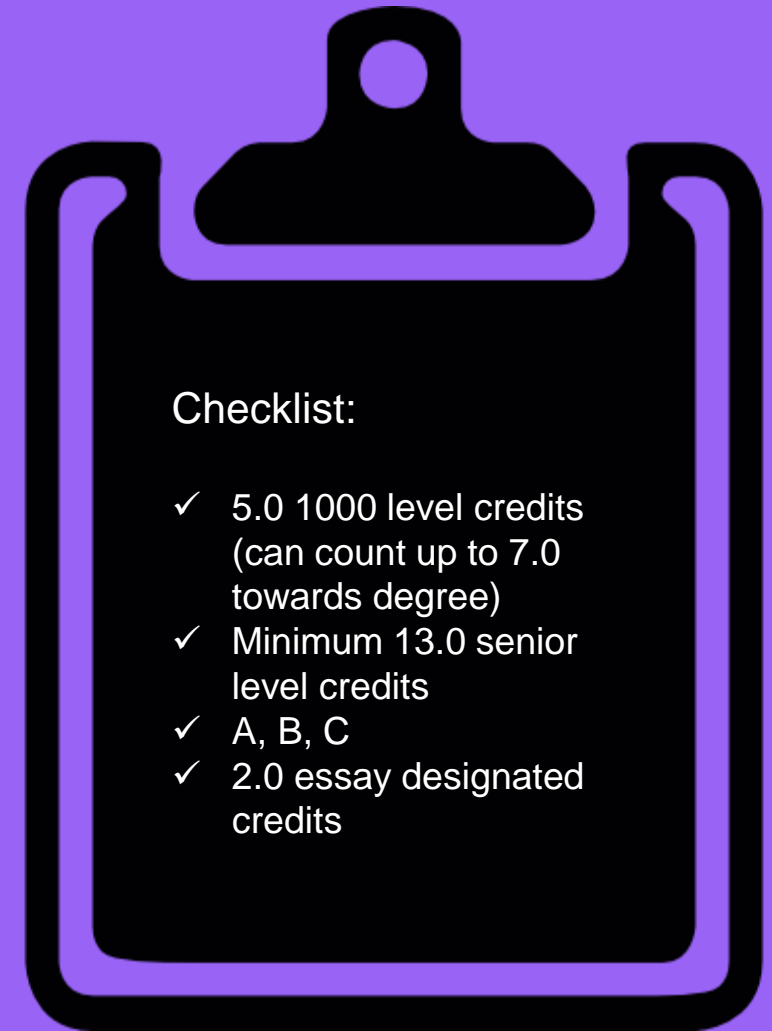

Degree Types

Four-year degree = 20.0 credits

- Honours (70% - 75% modular average, 60% minimum grade for all module courses, 65% cumulative average, no course fails)
- Non-honours (60% cumulative average)

Three-year degree = 15.0 credits



Module Combinations

DEGREE TYPES	AVAILABLE MODULES COMBINATIONS
Honours Bachelor Degree (4 year)	Honours Specialization Honours Specialization + Major Honours Specialization + Minor Major + Major
Bachelor Degree (4 year)	Specialization Specialization + Major Specialization + Minor Major + Major Major Major + Minor Major + Minor + Minor
Bachelor Degree (3 year)	Major Major + Minor Minor + Minor

Additional Modules

- It is not mandatory to select an additional Minor or Major
- Minors are not printed on your diploma
- Additional modules do not impact admissibility into professional programs
- Adding additional modules may increase the amount of time it takes to complete your degree
- Additional minors and majors can be dropped or added at any point during your degree

Summer Courses

- We will re-adjudicate a students file after completion of summer course(s). For example, if you receive a grade below 60% in Family Studies 1010A during fall you can choose to repeat it in summer. If you meet module admission requirements after completion of summer course(s) you can progress into the module for September

 - Family Studies 1015B
 - Sociology 1025A
 - Sociology 1027B
 - Psychology 1002A
 - Psychology 1003B
 - Foods and Nutrition 1070A

ITR Important Information

- If you are looking to continue in a Family Studies & Human Development module next year, this should be your first choice on the Intent to Register application
- **We complete a comprehensive review. If you do not qualify for your first choice, we will automatically review you for the next highest-level module for which you qualify prior to the review of your second choice.**

Example: Honours Specialization in Family Studies & Human Development – Specialization in Family Studies & Human Development – Major in Family Studies & Human Development

What If...

- **First-year students:** what if you do not meet the minimum requirements to remain in the Brescia School of Food and Nutritional Sciences (i.e. module pre-requisite below 60%, failed module pre-requisite etc.)
 - Did you face extenuating circumstances? If so, submit letter of support to be reviewed by our Progressions and Admissions Committee
 - If no letter of support is received, will be reviewed for 2nd ITR choice or moved to Undeclared (Arts, Social Science or Science)
- **Upper year students:** what if you do not meet the minimum requirements to remain in your current module (i.e. currently in Honours Specialization module and have a module grade below 60% etc.)
 - Did you face extenuating circumstances? If so, submit letter of support to be reviewed by our Progressions and Admissions Committee
 - If no letter of support is received, will automatically be reviewed for the next highest-level module you qualify for

Letter of Support

- First year students not eligible to progress into a Brescia School of Food and Nutritional Sciences module that had extenuating circumstances impact their academic performance are encouraged to complete a Letter of Support
- Upper year students not eligible to progress in their current module that had extenuating circumstances impact their academic performance are encouraged to complete a Letter of Support
- Students who submit a letter will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by a Progressions and Admissions Committee and will receive a letter with the decision.

The letter must be submitted to fnsinfo@uwo.ca by April 30. A copy of the letter can be found on our website under “Intent to Register”. Students must submit copies of supporting documentation along with their Letter of Support.
