Health Sciences 3141Y – Health Advocacy

Advocacy plays a key role in the development of health policy. The Canadian Public Health Association, for example, describes advocacy as a “core function” of public health associations. Effective advocacy requires both knowledge and experience, which students will develop by creation of an advocacy campaign that will impact local communities and beyond.

Prerequisite(s): Permission of the School of Health Studies; Enrolment in the in third or fourth year of an Honors degree in the School of Health Studies with a minimum cumulative average of 80%.

Pre-or Corequisite(s): Health Sciences 3101A/B; Health Sciences 3400A/B

Note: The “Y” course indicates that students will be taking this course for the full year, and receiving 0.5 credit. Students taking this course could be in an unbalanced course load and in most cases and overload. There is an expectation that students enrolled in this course are aware of the increased workload of an overload and plan their academics accordingly. You must have an 80% average to apply to this course.
