Linguistics 1027A Introduction to Linguistics (Job ID 39477)

0.5 course: Fall 2025 (September 1 – December 31, 2025)

Online asynchronous

Description: Introduction to basic concepts and methods of modern linguistics. Topics include articulatory and acoustic phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax and semantics. This course is a prerequisite for subsequent linguistics courses in the Department of Anthropology and/or the Linguistics program.

Education Level: Candidates should have a PhD (or be close to completion) in linguistics or a closely-related field, and a demonstrated record of performance in university-level teaching in linguistics. Candidates with only a Master's degree will also be considered if they have a demonstrated record of performance in university-level teaching in linguistics.

0.5 course: Winter 2026 (January 1 – April 30, 2026)

Online asynchronous

Linguistics 2247B Phonological Analysis (Job ID 39479)

0.5 course: Winter 2026 (January 1 – April 30, 2026)

In-person: Wednesday, 12:30pm - 3:30pm

Description: An introduction to the analysis of sound systems of languages. Includes discussion of the basic units of sound, their patterns of distribution and alternation. Topics to be covered are: articulatory phonetics, acoustic phonetics, distinctive feature theory, the writing of rules to describe phonological patterns. The generative framework will be emphasized.
