Description :

N.B.: Ce cours est enseigné à distance dans le mode synchrone; ce n'est pas un cours en ligne (This course is taught remotely and synchronously; it is not an online course)

Ce cours s'adresse aux étudiant(e)s qui suivent pour la première fois un cours de traduction. La pratique de traduction est un exercice qui est à la fois intéressant et problématique; intéressant parce qu'il y a du plaisir à jongler avec les détours et contours qu'une seule langue offre sous ses formes grammaticales, stylistiques et contextuelles, mais encore plus intéressant même quand il s'agit, pour notre cas, de deux langues, à savoir le français et l'anglais. Et bien-sûr problématique parce que les deux langues sont, pour le moins qu'on en dise, différentes. En plus du manuel du cours d'autres textes et exercices stylistiques seront progressivement distribués.

Objectifs pédagogiques:

A la fin de ce cours, l'étudiant-e- sera capable de:

- Comprendre, de façon générale, une gamme de différences et de similitudes qui existent entre l'anglais et le français, par la voie de la stylistique comparée
- Utiliser des méthodes et surmonter certains défis qui vont avec le processus de la traduction
- Démontrer des progrès évidents dans l'amélioration de leurs connaissances en français.

Owl

Des outils importants conçus pour faciliter l'apprentissage du français ont été mis sur Owl. Vous y trouverez des éléments relatifs à l'écriture, mais aussi des exercices supplémentaires de grammaire, de vocabulaire et de traduction. Il est nécessaire d'utiliser OWL régulièrement.

Déroulement du cours :

1. Tests :

Deux tests de compréhension seront donnés sur OWL. Chaque test durera 50 minutes et couvrira le matériel qui aura été vu, y compris le matériel des présentations orales. If you do not submit the test in due time, you will have to provide written justification from your academic counselor in your home Faculty in order to write the test.

You will be given 24 hours within which you will have to submit your 50-minute timed Test.

2. Exposé (Présentation orale)

Chaque étudiant(e) fera une présentation orale, individuellement (15 minutes) ou en groupes de deux (25 minutes) sur un sujet choisi en accord avec le professeur. *Ces présentations seront organisées au cours du semestre.*

3. Participation :

You are encouraged to attend the weekly two hours on Zoom and actively participate during the lesson. It will be a synchronous session. Each non-justified absence will make you lose 10%. Self-reporting will be justified.

This being an intensive translation course, one hour per week, every Tuesday, will be reserved for you to do the work required and prepare for lessons, individually or in

groups. I will be available on Tuesdays from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm to answer questions via email or Zoom.

4. L'Examen final:

L'examen final aura lieu pendant la période des examens et couvrira l'essentiel du cours et comptera pour 40% de la note finale. It will be a three-hour exam on Owl and you will be given up to 24 hours before you submit. Note that once you start it within those 24 hours you will only have 3 hours to finish it and submit it.

Academic Consideration for Student Absence

If the conditions for a Self-Reported Absence are *not* met, students will need to provide a Student Medical Certificate if the absence is medical, or provide appropriate documentation if there are compassionate grounds for the absence in question. Students are encouraged to contact their Faculty academic counselling office to obtain more information about the relevant documentation.

Students should also note that individual instructors are not permitted to receive documentation directly from a student, whether in support of an application for consideration on medical grounds, or for other reasons. **All documentation required for absences that are not covered by the Self-Reported Absence Policy must be submitted to the Academic Counselling office of a student's Home Faculty.**
