It was founded approximately **2,200 years ago**




The city was the **melting pot of many cultures**

HOST INSTITUTION

CINECU – CENTRO INTERNACIONAL DE ESTUDIOS CULTURALES

CINECU was founded in 1996 and it has been bringing students to Seville for over 20 years.

CINECU is housed on the Campus Universitario EUSA., which is affiliated with the University of Seville and the Seville Chamber of Commerce.

This location provides an active university campus with the accommodations essential to a successful academic program, while permitting interaction with Spanish students.

TRANSATLANTIC CULTURE, COMMERCE AND THE MODERN WORLD

INSTRUCTOR: PROF. NATALIA COUSTÉ, PH. D. (CINECU)

In this course, we will discover the role Seville played in the origination of the first transatlantic culture, resulting from the encounter between Europe and the New World in 1492. This event set the pillars on which the first transatlantic culture was created. We will discuss how Seville was one of the most important cities in Europe and why it served as the cultural axis between the New World and Europe for centuries.

In addition to exploring the economic importance of Seville to the world today, we will also delve into Spanish society and customs, and learn about local culture, architecture, art and traditions that continue to shape the city's identity into the present day. We will discover how these symbols have evolved through history and how they impact the relationship Sevillians have with their city to this day.

 - Students who are at their 3rd or 4th years will be able to get a special permission → course will be counted and satisfy the Spanish major/minor requirements




