Speak and write more fluently, express yourself more idiomatically and with greater precision. Take your German to the next level while gaining new insights into the culture and history of the German-speaking countries.

This content-based course will be taught almost entirely in German. Students will get plenty of practice speaking, reading and writing German in a small class setting. Explore cultural topics through authentic readings, films, websites, literature, and music, and learn about life in the German-speaking countries. The course also includes a grammar review and prepares students to master the more challenging points of German grammar.

Course Aims:

- To further improve students' communication skills
- To read some more challenging texts in German
- To help students write more smoothly and correctly
- To review some challenging aspects of German grammar
- To put everything into the context of German culture

Learning Outcomes:

It is expected that, upon completion of this course, students will be able to do the following:

- Speak and write in a more nuanced way and with greater precision
- Find it much easier to read sophisticated authentic texts
- Master some difficult aspects of German grammar
- Demonstrate an understanding of many concepts of intercultural communication

Tests will be written during regular class time.

Active participation means attending every class and coming prepared. To get good participation marks you must prepare any assigned grammar and content exercises before class, do the readings, and review material from previous classes. You are expected to make an effort to speak German in both class contributions and group work.

A short composition on a prepared topic will be written at the end of the first term.

Each student will give two short oral presentations in first term and one in second term.

There will be an oral assessment of each student towards the end of year, to assess progress in speaking as well as listening comprehension.
