Clarinet Jury Requirements

Last revised September 2020

<u>Year 1</u> M1140, M1925

Repertoire should be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 15 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

<u>Year 1</u> M1920

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire - at least <u>one piece</u> from the following list of required works and the others may be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. These evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

<u>Year 2</u> M2925

Repertoire should be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course

syllabus.

Year 2 M2920, 2921, 2922

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire - at least <u>one piece</u> from the following list of required works and the others may be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. These evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 3 M3925

Repertoire should be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 3 M3924y, M3929

Repertoire should be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes (for M3924y 15 minutes). Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Their evaluations will take place in lessons and more formally with an exam in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Specific requirements

and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 3 M3920

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire - at least <u>one piece</u> from the following list of required works and the others may be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. These evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 3 M3921

The required work and orchestral excerpts must be prepared for the December jury and amount to 10 minutes of music. A substitution for the required work may be used for transfer students and only with the permission of the studio instructor. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 3 M3922

Three pieces, including the required work, and orchestral excerpts must be prepared for the jury and total playing time not less than 20 minutes. A substitution for the required work may be used for transfer students and only with the permission of the studio instructor. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 4 M4925

Repertoire should be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. Two or three pieces should be selected to contrast in style and must amount to a total playing time not less than 20 minutes. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Year 4 M4924y, M4929

Repertoire should be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List in consultation with the studio teacher to ensure appropriate level of difficulty. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission. All selected repertoire must amount to a total playing time not less than 30 minutes (for M4924y 15 minutes). Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Their evaluations will take place in lessons and more formally with an exam in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

<u>Year 4</u> M4920

In consultation with the studio teacher, students must prepare 3 pieces of repertoire totaling 30 minutes of music - at least <u>one piece</u> from the following list of required works and the others may be selected from the Clarinet Repertoire List. Substitutions are permitted with instructor's permission.

Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. These evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

The required work and orchestral excerpts must be prepared for a December jury, preparing 10 minutes of music. A substitution for the required work may be used for transfer students and only with the permission of the studio instructor. Technique and etudes will not be required for juries. Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.

Students will be responsible for technique and etude preparation for lessons. Evaluations will take place in December before mid-term marks and in April before jury evaluations. Both technique and etude evaluations will be factored into the end-of-year lesson mark. Specific requirements and times will be documented in the course syllabus.
