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## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This class will explore the concepts of sex, gender, and sexuality as they are lived and experienced as well as theorized. We will treat each category as a site of ontological, epistemic, political and moral controversy. In so doing, we will attend to the complex ways in which, together, expressions of sex, gender and sexuality enable subjectivity, knowledge, collective and personal identity, autonomy, oppression, social control and moral and political demands and actions.

Topics include: biological determinism and social construction; language and performativity; challenges to binary models of sex/gender/sexuality; expressions of gender, including femininities and masculinities; neurosexism and sex/gender in science; transsexuality; disability, sexuality and pornography; and sexual violence.

# **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

- 1) To develop students' abilities to make and critique philosophical arguments;
- 2) To familiarize students with relevant debates in feminist and queer theory and to understand the complexity of these debates;
- 3) To enable students to articulate and revise their own positions on these debates, including as they appear in academic literature and popular media.
