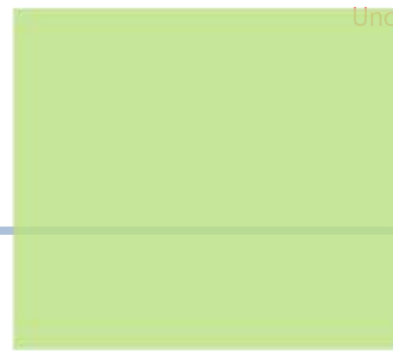

OVERVIEW

- [Horizon Europe - Pillar II: Global challenges and European industrial competitiveness](#)
- SSHRC Destination Horizon Grants: support researchers affiliated with eligible Canadian postsecondary institutions
 - Build capacity
 - Foster existing partnerships
 - Further develop networks and/or consortia with European Union and other Associated Countries

KEY CHARACTERISTICS

Value	\$15,000
Duration	1 year
Frequency	3 deadlines per year (January 22, May 22, September 22) until January 2027
Participants	Single researcher or teams of researchers; no partner organizations
Matching Funds	100% cash contribution from host institution
Number of Awards	27 awards available for the January 2025 competition; 5 per each subsequent competition
Institutional Limits	3 applications per institution per competition
Individual Limits	An individual may apply multiple times per year, but once an individual has an award they may not apply again



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The [eligibility requirements](#) comprise:
 - Readiness to create or further develop networks and/or consortia
 - Eligible budget requests as per the [Tri-Agency Guide on Financial Administration](#)
 - 100% matching cash contributions from host institution

Subject Matter Eligibility

- Ensure that subject matter eligibility is aligned with SSHRC's mandate
- The program of research must be primarily in the social sciences and humanities (i.e., aligned with the [SSHRC legislated mandate](#)) and;
- The intended outcome of the project must primarily be to add to our understanding and knowledge of individuals, groups, and societies - what we think, how we live and how we interact with each other and the world around us.
- The use of social science or humanities theories, methodologies and hypotheses is, in and of itself, not sufficient to make the proposal eligible at SSHRC.

Subject Matter Eligibility (cont'd)

- **Subject Matter Related to Health**

- Research primarily intended to improve health, produce more effective health services and products and/or strengthen the health care system in Canada or internationally (e.g., research concerning the treatment, prevention or diagnosis of a condition, the evaluation of the effectiveness of health programs, the development of health management systems, etc.) **is not eligible for consideration at SSHRC.**
- Research involving clinical trials, with a health research orientation, is not eligible for SSHRC support.
- Research that is eligible under the [mandate of CIHR](#) will not be considered by SSHRC.

- Host Institution Letter of Support

Selection process

- Eligibility Review

- SSHRC staff will determine eligibility

- Randomized Selection Process

- All eligible applications will have random number assigned to them
 - Grants will be selected in order from smallest random number to largest random number until financial resources are exhausted
