Course Description

A continuation of the study of multivariate probability and stochastic processes. This course builds on the background developed in the second year courses, and focuses on the more advanced aspects of multivariate probability, namely transformations where the domain of random variables must be carefully considered.

Course Objectives

This course provides a thorough treatment of the concepts of probability, properties of random variables, conditional expectation and transformations of variables, among other topics. The successful student will become adept at carrying out the techniques and in understanding why they are needed.

Course Materials

The recommended textbook is Mathematical Statistics and Data Analysis, Third Edition, by J. A. Rice

This textbook is available at the Taylor Library's service desk.

The course will focus on sections from the first six chapters.

The remaining chapters will be covered in part in SS3858B.

Methods of Evaluation

The overall course grade will be calculated as follows:
